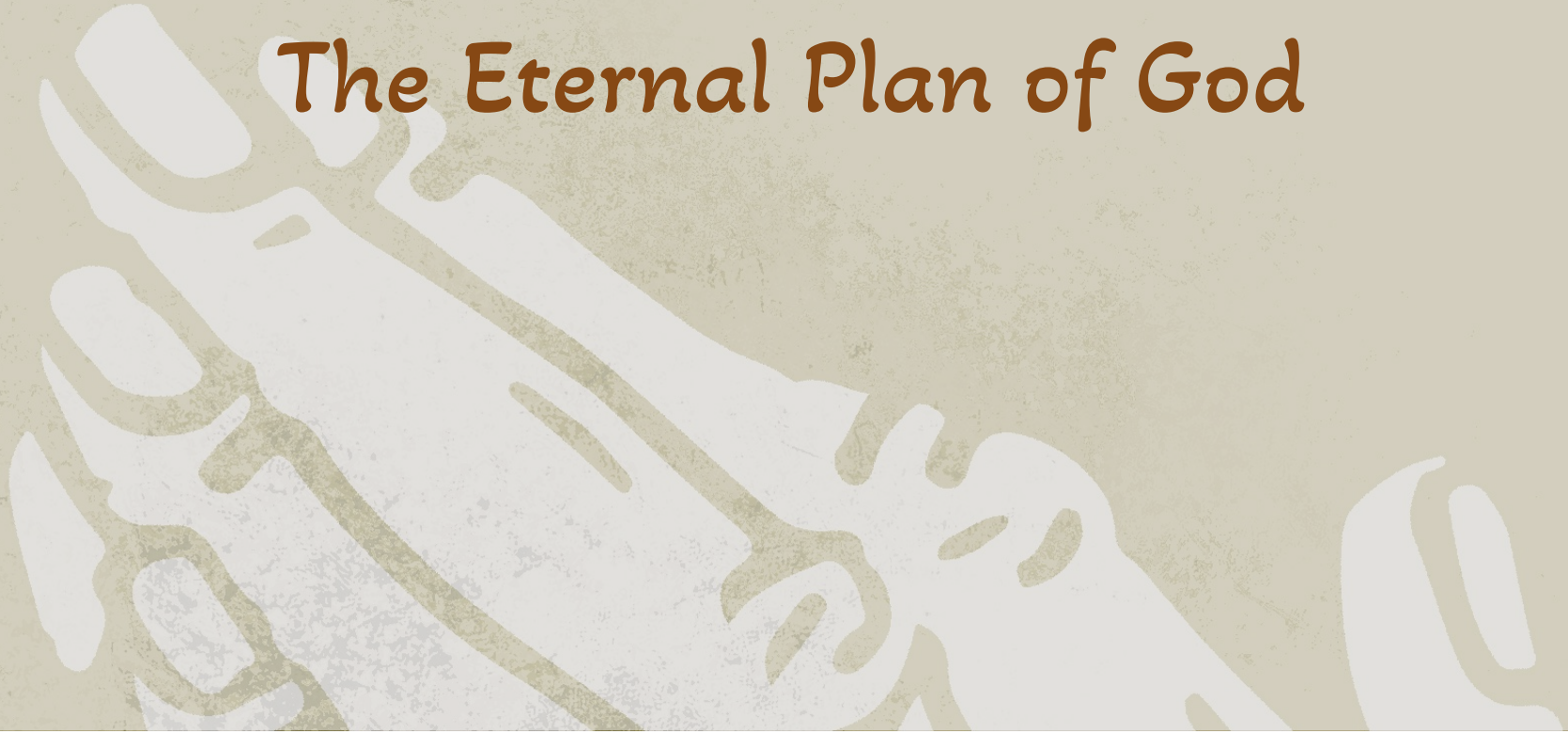

What is rooted? What is grounded? What is love?


The tree of Calvary was rooted. The Cross was grounded.

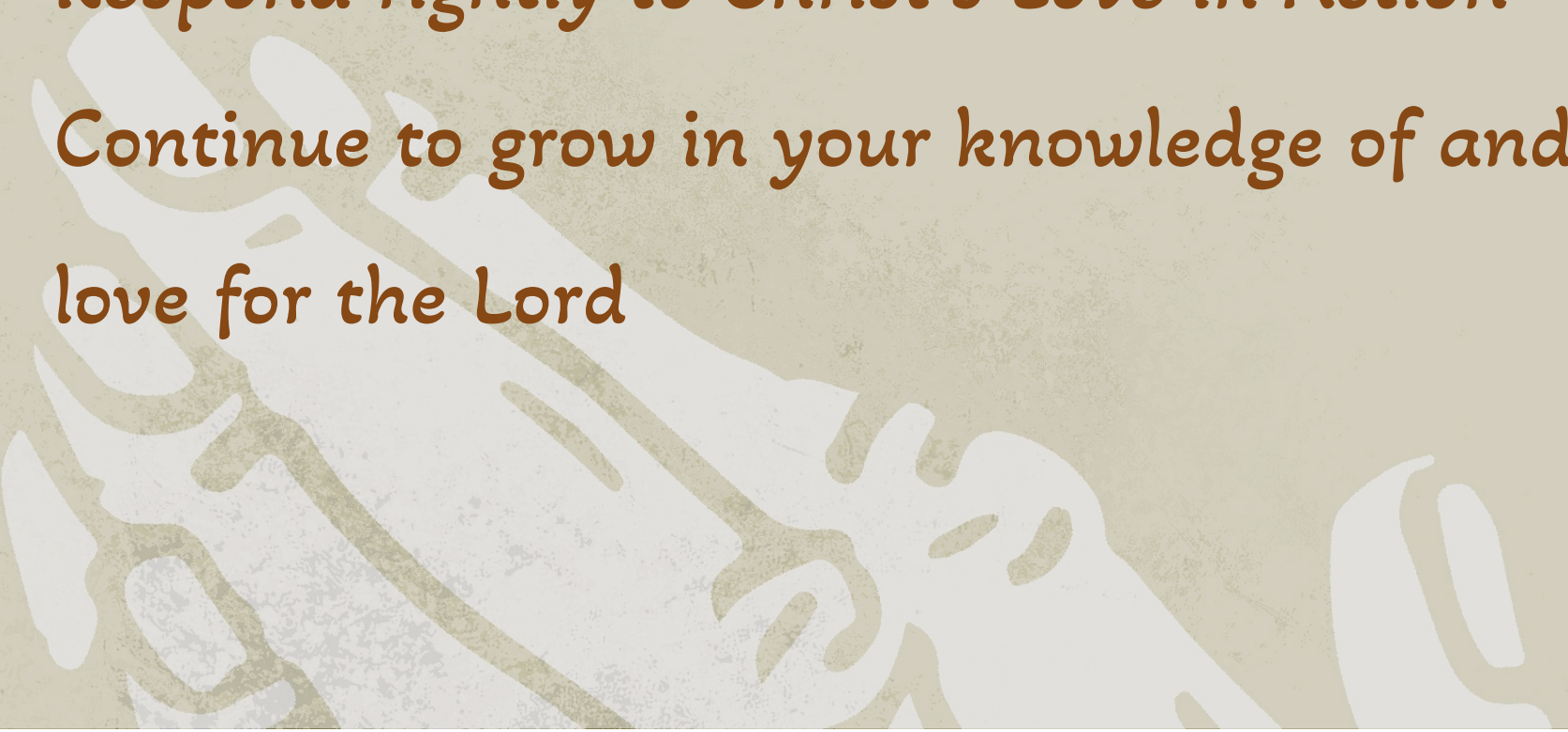



