2. The NT – He came (Gospels), this is what is coming meant (Acts & Epistles) and He’s coming again (Revelation)

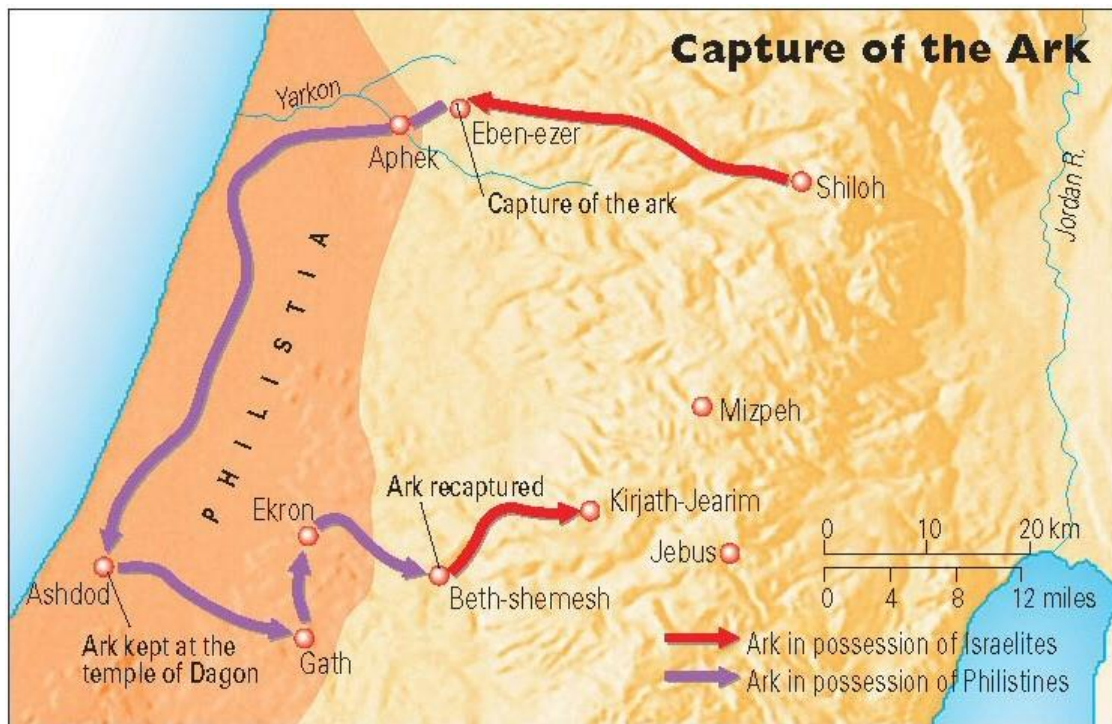

On Covenants

What it is: "A covenant is a legally binding agreement between two parties. It is often solemnized or ratified by an oath or other means and usually places demands on one or both parties."

Elements:

- Between 2 parties
- Solemnized / Ratified by Oath
- Unilateral or Bilateral
- Consequences for not fulfilling the demands

III. God Secures an Eternal Kingdom by Covenant Promise (9b–17)

A. Promises Realized During David's Lifetime

1. Make a Great Name (9b) – *Fulfilled in 2 Sam. 5:10; 8:13; 2 Chr. 14:17*
2. Appoint a Place (10-11a) – *Fulfilled in 2 Sam. 8:1-14*
3. Give Rest (11b) – *Fulfilled in 2 Sam. 7:1; 8:14*

B. Promises Realized After David's Lifetime

1. Make a House (11c)
2. Raise up his Descendent (12)
3. Establish the throne of his Kingdom forever (13,16)

1. House

- ✓ I will build My church (Matt. 16:18; Acts 2)

2. Seed

- ✓ Understanding in the OT (Ps. 2:6; Isa. 9:6-7; Jer. 23:5)
- ✓ Announced at His Birth (Luke 1:32-33; Matt. 1:1)
- ✓ Proclaimed during His Earthly Ministry (Matt. 9:27; 15:22; 20:30-31; 21:15; Mark 10:47-48; Luke 18:38-39)
- ✓ Declared through His Resurrection (Acts 2:29-31; 2 Tim. 2:8)

3. Forever Kingdom / Throne

- ✓ Confirmed in His Revelation (Rev. 11:15; Rev. 22:16)

Necessity of the Davidic Covenant

1. It Secures God's Promise of an Eternal King
2. It Reveals God's Faithfulness Despite Human Failure
3. It Demands our Submission to Christ's Sovereign Rule
